Minutes of Meeting

Councilman Carden made a motion to approve the minutes from the May meeting as written. Councilman Wrights seconded him and Councilman Smith abstained. Motion passed 2-0-1.

Financial Report

Councilman Wright made a motion to approve the Financial Report as submitted. Councilman Smith seconded him and Councilman Carden concurred. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

1. 5-year work program:

- Research adoption of tree ordinance – Councilman Carden has not reached back out to Bill Johnston yet.
- Work with ARC, GDOT, and Fayette County on sidewalks – Nothing to report
- Develop social media channels, logo and tag line – Councilman Wright provided some photos to Councilman Smith. Tag line “Where life is slower and simpler” Councilman Smith asked if interested in official Facebook and/or Instagram? Would need administrator. Will develop a questionnaire to see what the residents want pertaining to communication and social media.
- Create committees to tackle issues such as historic preservation and communication – Nothing to report.

2. Transportation Committee Update – Caitlyn said that there were no major updates as Transportation Committee meeting is on the 11th. The change order was approved so project should go to design which this phase should go quickly. Mayor Laggis asked her to follow up with Phil Mallon in regards to the electronic speed monitoring.

3. Agreed Upon Procedures Report – No exceptions noted.

4. Other – Owners of house across street cited for home being in imminent danger of collapse. Court date is July 31st. City attorney David Ballard plans on attending.

New Business

1. 6 Month Financial Review – Knew that painting of building would be needed but not budgeted for. Put pest control and garbage in operating budget in FY2024.
